Premiere Exhibit of Artist's Life's Work Opens July 17, 2010

SANTA ANA, CA— For thousands of years, man has enjoyed the art of stone carving, also known as lapidary. Five thousand years ago, the Chinese began carving jade into mythical animals, and later the tradition of stone carving was carried on by the Greeks, Romans, and other cultures around Europe.

In more recent times, the art of the legendary Carl Faberge has stood out. The tradition of stone carving exists in China today with massive amounts of jade and other materials being carved in distinctly Asian styles. Western styles of Faberge are much more limited with most of the work coming from a small pair of villages in Germany known as Idar-Oberstein.

The fine art of stone carving is being quietly carried out by one individual here in the United States -- Harold Van Pelt. On July 17, the Bowers Museum presents the premiere exhibition of his life's work in *Gemstone Carvings: Masterworks by Harold Van Pelt*. The exhibit is on view through May 31, 2011.

Van Pelt and his wife Erica are among the finest gem photographers in the world today, yet few people realize that Mr. Van Pelt has been pursuing another art -- the art of stone carving -- for almost 40 years. Gemstone Carvings: Masterworks by Harold Van Pelt is the first time

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that anyone has ever had the opportunity to see the full body of Van Pelt's work in one place.

All of Mr. Van Pelt's work is done in quartz, or rock crystal, or agate, a banded variety of quartz -- the same materials used by gem carvers since ancient times due to its beauty, durability, and availability. Hundreds of hours go into working the stone down to paper-thin walls, bringing out the gorgeous natural quality and colors of the agate and the rock crystal the transparency of glass.

One of the most fascinating pieces in the exhibit is a faceted egg, which is different from all others because this egg is hollow and the walls are paper thin.
