

# Shanghai Museum and Bowers Museum Sign Memorandum of Understanding to Foster Cultural Collaboration



Santa Ana, CA (March 5, 2025) –Bowers Museum and the Shanghai Museum officially signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on Friday, February 28,2025 at Bowers Museum in Santa Ana, California. This landmark agreement establishes a framework for ongoing collaboration between the two prestigious institutions, strengthening cultural ties between the United States and China.

The Bowers Museum has a longstanding collaboration with the Shanghai Museum, bringing world-class Chinese art to its audiences through past exhibitions such as *Treasures from Shanghai: 5000 Years of Art and Culture* (2007), which showcased artifacts spanning the Neolithic period to the Qing dynasty. Its current exhibition, *Ancient Arts of China: A 5000 Year Legacy*, curated with the Shanghai Museum, continues this tradition by presenting painted ceramics, Silk Road-era sculptures, embroidered silk court robes, and intricate ivory carvings.



Under the terms of the new MOU, the Shanghai Museum will collaborate with Bowers Museum on various initiatives, including the exchange of exhibitions, loans of artworks and artifacts, and the application of new technologies in museum curation and education. "This new chapter in our partnership is a monumental step in fostering international museum collaborations," said Dr. Seán O'Harrow of Bowers Museum. "Through this exchange, we are excited to bring more world-class exhibitions to our audiences and further enrich cultural dialogue between our communities."

Both institutions have committed to maintaining regular and effective communication regarding exhibitions, public education programs, and other joint initiatives. The MOU represents a serious commitment from both parties to work towards shared goals. The agreement will remain in effect for five years, with opportunities for renewal and expansion.
